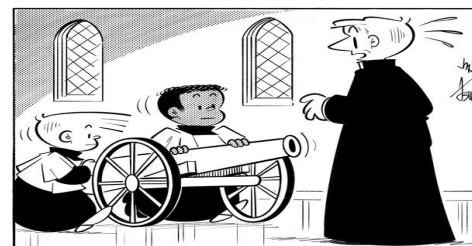
Who Does God Want You To Be?
